




2025 General Tax Rate: LBT Area





2025 General Tax Rate: LBT v/o Stafford








2025 Harrey Cedars





2025 BT Ocean Country Tax Rate







SRSD School Tax Issue with Bob Danna HCTA ANNUAL MEETING, August 23, 2025

"Tale of Two Taxpayers"





The Issue

The share of the Southern Regional School District (SRSD) school tax that HC and LBI pay compared with Stafford Twp's share is highly disproportionate and absolutely unfair to the taxpayers of Harvey Cedars and LBI.



The Facts

of Students % School Tax

LBI 178 (8%) 80%

Stafford 2,040 (92%) <20%

HC 5 (0.2%) 5.2%



More Facts

- LBI's cost per student is about \$241,000
- Stafford's cost per student is \$5,000!
- HC's cost per student is a whopping \$559,000
 - >100 XS Stafford's cost/student
- NB:
 - 1. The average cost to educate a student in NJ this yr. is about \$26.6K
 - 2. The per student cost in the SRSD budget is: \$23.6K/yr.
- Both are 4 to 5 Xs > what Stafford pays per student.



The Point

The SRSD school tax is a <u>fairness</u> issue AND a <u>resource</u> issue.

- LBI pays > 80% of the tax, has 8% of the students, so consequently uses ~ 8% of the educational resources available.
- HC uses <u>0.2%</u> and pays 5.2% of the tab.
 - This year we will pay 26 Xs more in tax than we actually use in educational services.



Ok, this is not good, so let's change how the tax is determined!



The Impediment

(NJSA 18A:13-23)

Current NJ law requires <u>each</u> town in any regional district to agree (i.e., vote YES), via referendum, to:

- 1. Withdraw from the district, and / or
- 2. Change the manner in which the tax is distributed among the towns

In effect, the law allows constituent towns that benefit financially to maintain the status quo (read: STAFFORD Twp) by blocking ANY and ALL changes.



The Solution New (Proposed) Legislation

New legislation (in an ideal world) would allow for a change in the distribution of the school tax among existing district towns when:

- 1. Any town's cost per student is more than n% compared to any other town's cost/student in the district
- 2. Any town in the district, thru referendum, votes to change the distribution method, or withdraw w/o being vetoed

Any proposed withdrawal or distribution change would require review and approval by the Dept of Ed.

NJ State Assembly Task Force RECOMMENDATIONS

For Regional School Districts

- 1. Regionalization agreements should be structured in such a way so as to allow reassessment of cost distribution if the per pupil cost deviates by more than 10% between any two constituent municipalities of the regional district, in order to reflect the growth of one or more of the constituent municipalities.
- 2. The equalized valuation method for apportioning costs in a regional school district, which almost all the existing regionalized school districts utilize, is a disincentive to school district regionalization. A new and fairer formula should be devised to provide for more equity among constituent municipalities ... there should be a realistic mechanism which compels equitable adjustments in the distribution of costs among constituent municipalities for the small number of existing regionalized districts which currently evidence an extreme disproportionate distribution of costs.

HC Qualifies

Amendment #1 suggests a change:

"...in cost distribution if the per pupil cost deviates by more than 10% between any two constituent municipalities.."

```
HC Cost / Student = $559,000
Stafford Cost / Student = $5,000
```

HC's cost per student is more than 100 Xs Stafford's cost/student!



A Fair Method

Assuming a law change, NJ law already allows for 3 methods of tax sharing for newly-formed districts.


The tax share can be based on:

- 1. Equalized property valuations (our current situation)
- 2. The proportional number of pupils enrolled, or
- 3. A combination of the above 2 methods.

The <u>obvious</u> solution is to use the <u>3rd method</u>, resulting in: less disproportionate tax for LBI/HC <u>and</u> a fair tax for Stafford Twp.

Raising Awareness

Mayor Imperiale:

- Met with and reviewed the presentation and the issue with gubernatorial candidate Jack Ciattarelli
- Sent the presentation to gubernatorial candidate Mikie Sherrill
- Requested our HC attorney to review the issue and determine appropriate / legal actions
- LBI Mayors:
 - Met with all LBI Mayors on August 18, 2025 to discuss the issue and review the presentation.
 - The LBI Mayors agreed to have the Surf City Municipal Attorney also re-look at the issue and take any and all appropriate steps.



Summary

- The SRSD school tax paid by LBI -- and especially Harvey Cedars -- is disproportionate and unjust.
- The inequity <u>can</u> be resolved in a fair manner starting with new legislation.
- The current law needs to be amended to allow existing districts to choose among the 3 tax allocation methods <u>already available</u> to newly formed regional districts.
- Our legislators need to act.











- July 2024: Approved plan to sell the LBI Grade School property
- Fall 2024: Property under contract with a local builder
 - Contingent on certain approvals
- June 2025: LBI School vacated
- Aug 2025: Approvals not yet in place, transaction expected to close early fall
- Sale proceeds [along with reserves] will fund the Ethel Jacobsen School expansion / renovation
 - School Board cannot go out for bid on the project until the sale is complete
 - Anticipate higher construction costs due to expanded timeline


